#### The Great Wall of China

I was so excited when I started out from Beijing. I'd hired a jeep and an interpreter, as well as camping gear, and I was off to see the only thing ever made by man that is visible from space: that long, continuous structure that is more than 2,000 years old. However, my excitement began to disappear when I learned that these 'facts', were nothing more than urban legends.

One of the facts that I had learned was indeed true; although much of the wall had been built during the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644), some parts of it do date from the seventh century BC. As I left Beijing, I realised that the further away I got from the Chinese capital and all the tourist haunts, the more the wall was in need of repair. In some places along my route it didn't exist at all. This was particularly noticeable at the reservoir that had been created by the dam built on the Luan River in the 1970s. Sometimes there were other walls running parallel to the Great Wall. At one point I saw a Han Dynasty wall (206BC-AD 220) parallel to the Ming wall, and it was dwarfed by it. If a villager hadn't pointed it out to us, we wouldn't have spotted it.

We were lucky to find that villager. He had done a lot of research into the wall in his area. He had gone through the county archives, but he had also interviewed many elderly people who told him stories about the wall which had been passed down from generation to generation, and he had copied them all down. He'd written lots of pages and illustrated them with sketches and maps, and he had also collected broken pieces of pottery which he had found near the walls over the years. These would be invaluable to anyone wishing to study the history of this part of the wall but, instead, here they were, perfectly stored and kept in labelled boxes in the man's home! He was a farmer, earning about 200 US dollars a year. I wished I could have photocopies of his work, but I knew that there was no possibility of finding a photocopier nearby. I might have had to drive for hours, or even days, before I found one. I did take photographs of the bits of pottery though.

That night we camped near the road under the stars. They were much brighter than they seem when you see them from an urban area. I began to understand how ancient

people had made up their myths to explain how the constellations had formed. The stars must have had a powerful fascination for our ancestors, who would have seen them as I was seeing them now, without modern street lights which obscure their brilliance. Then, just as I was falling asleep, a bright light shone into my tent. I panicked because I thought it was a huge truck bearing down on me, the driver having made a mistake on the road. I crawled outside, and saw the moon rising over a hill. What a magnificent sight! One that I will always remember.

The next day we clattered along dirt tracks, sometimes with the wheels sinking into unavoidable potholes. This was all part of the adventure. Occasionally, part of the road would be covered in asphalt, but then it would abruptly end and we'd be on a dirt road again. Every so often I stopped to take photographs of the towers and walls into which people had built their homes. The one house that I got to see the inside of, thanks to my interpreter, had walls that were twenty feet thick, which kept it warm in winter and cool in summer. Of course, they had not been originally built to house people, but to defend the Chinese empire against attack from foreigners, or 'Hu' as they call them.

Other photographs were of people on top of the Wall using their mobile phones, which could not get a signal at ground level. I found it amusing that the Great Wall was still being used to aid communication. In the past, smoke signals would be sent along it all the way to Beijing so that the emperor could receive news from the outposts of his empire. Still other photographs were of labourers repairing parts of the Wall, using traditional methods rather than modern machinery and new technology.

Occasionally our way was blocked by sheep which were using the holes in the wall as tunnels to get to new grazing land. People have, over the centuries, taken bricks and stones from the Wall to build their homes. Sometimes we had to stop because the road was blocked by people watching a group of travelling actors or singers performing from the back of their truck. Many of these were performing at funerals. This was a trip I will always remember; a once-in-a-lifetime experience.

#### Istanbul: Memories of a City

Orhan Pamuk Nobel Prize winner 2006 (unabridged)

This is both a personal account of a city from the perspective of a fifty-something author looking back on his childhood, adolescence and early adulthood, as well as a brief history of Istanbul. It has black and white photographs and other illustrations to accompany the cassette or DVD, so that you can see pictures that go with what you are listening to. Pamuk is obviously very much attached to his home city, and the listener will understand his love for the city despite the melancholy felt by the author, the people who inhabit the city, and even the city itself. If you enjoy Pamuk's novels, this book, although factual, is a must.

#### 2 Tanglewreck

Jeanette Winterson (unabridged)

Better known as a writer of fiction for adults, the author shows with this book that she can also appeal to children. This is a fantasy along the lines of Philip Pullman's 'His Dark Materials' trilogy. The heroine is young and has lost her parents. She has to make a difficult choice towards the end of the story, and the listener really gets drawn into her dilemma. Will she make the right decision? Will she end up judging others by appearances? Adults will also get caught up in the plot, although Winterson fans should be warned that it does move away from some of her more usual themes.

#### 3 Lord of the Rings

JRR Tolkein (abridged)

Some of the scenes which weren't in the movies aren't in the recording, but what is lacking from the original trilogy is made up for in the narration by a cast of well-known British actors who really make the scenes and characters come to life. You can simply listen to the tale as fantasy, or think of the time it was written and understand Tolkein's comparisons to the period before and during the Second World War. The creatures are pure fantasy, but with human characteristics and, ultimately, order is restored and good triumphs over evil. An original fantasy which has had its imitators.

#### USA

John Dos Passos (unabridged)

In book form this looks very heavy, and you'd probably use it as a doorstop, but it's great to listen to. The book has just been reprinted, after being out of print for a number of years. It tells the stories of the early union movement and follows hobos jumping freight cars. It's an audio book that will interest anyone who's interested in the early twentieth-century history of the States. The narrator makes the prose interesting and, given the author's style, which was innovative for the time, it will appeal to a wider audience than the original book did. Remember, though, that this is a novel, not a completely factual account. What it does is give the listener a feel for the era, and some understanding of what life was like during those times.

#### 5

#### **The Collected Works**

Richard Brautigan

Now, after years of being out of print, Brautigan's works have been reprinted, and the audio collection also includes the author himself reading his poetry. In his lifetime he had his biggest success with the novels 'Trout Fishing in America', 'In Watermelon Sugar' and 'A Confederate General from Big Sur'. He achieved cult status, and subsequent authors have adopted and adapted his style. These are easy-to-listen-to recordings full of humour, and which will remind listeners of the late 1960s and 70s. #### **Volunteer Opportunities**

Karen Kyte looks at the volunteer opportunities available in the area.

#### Δ

As a boy, Alan Michaels was brought up by his grandparents. They gave him a lot of love, attention and anything (within reason) that money could buy but, looking back on his upbringing, he says, "I missed out on playing football with my dad and doing things like that. My grandparents, given their age and medical condition, couldn't do the things that most kids' parents do with them." He says that he feels he is a well-balanced adult, and puts that down to the caring environment in which he was raised. However, he became a volunteer because he felt that there was something lacking in his life. He's a "buddy", a young adult (he's 22) who befriends a child. He is currently a buddy to two boys, one aged 8, the other 6. One lives with his grandparents and the other with his mother. Alan is a father figure and role model for the boys. He hopes that they will value what he is trying to do for them, and one day be "buddies" themselves.

#### R

Pauline Saunders moved to a new area and didn't know anyone. She runs her own business from home, so she had some free time. "I'm not the type of person who is happy going out alone, and I felt really isolated," she said. "I saw an advertisement in the local paper for volunteers to take physically challenged adults on trips to the cinema, the theatre and to different places where they can do some sightseeing. I volunteered, and haven't looked back. I met other volunteers, and they introduced me to friends of theirs, plus the fact that I get on really well with some of the people I help. So now I feel much better. Not only am I doing something that benefits other people, but my own social situation has improved dramatically."

#### C

Halima Alam comes from Britain's Asian community. She graduated in Teaching English as a Foreign Language and multicultural education. She works in schools with refugees and immigrants that have recently arrived in the country, helping them learn the language. In the evenings she works as a volunteer, teaching English to women from the Asian community, so that they can function better in their daily lives. On some Saturdays, she goes shopping with them, helping them practise their English in a real situation. Sometimes, when necessary, she takes them to see a doctor and acts as an interpreter. She says, "Many women rely on their children to interpret for them in these situations. What I'm doing is helping them to be more independent. I think it's inappropriate for a mother to have to rely on a child to give information to a doctor."

Jared Connolly was brought up by foster parents and had very little contact with his real parents. "I'm glad in a way. My foster parents are great. We're very close. They wanted to adopt me, but my biological parents wouldn't sign the adoption papers. Not that it mattered; I've always regarded my foster parents as mum and dad." Jared works as a computer engineer, but he has always had a love of mechanical things - something he got from his foster mother, Jenny. So, as he had some free time on his hands, he volunteered to train teenagers doing community service how to repair and maintain cars and motorbikes. These teenagers then take part in a local scheme, where residents can have their vehicles repaired free of labour charges. They only have to pay for spare parts.

#### Mangrove Island

Island nations have problems with what to do with their waste. Singapore has come up with a novel way of dealing with the problem. In 1998 the government connected two off-shore islands with rocks and called the new island Pulau Semakau, which means Mangrove Island in Malay, and this is now Singapore's landfill site. (Mangroves are tropical trees whose roots grow above the ground.)

Since 1999, companies that collect waste have been recycling anything that can be recycled while incinerating the rest. Incineration, where rubbish is burned until it is completely destroyed, reduces the waste to ash and also generates about 3 percent of Singapore's electricity. The ash is dumped into a 'cell' (from which sea water has been pumped) which is lined with a thick layer of plastic. Every month, the water around the cell is tested to make sure that the waste is not seeping into the water and polluting it. There are eleven cells, four of which have been filled to around two metres above sea level. They have been covered with soil and planted with grass seeds. Now there are a few trees too, but these grew naturally with some help from birds.

When the landfill was being created, it was necessary to move some of the mangroves that were already on the island and environmentalists feared that many would die, but their fears turned out to be groundless. Now the island has more than thirteen hectares of mangroves, which are home to many species of animals. The island's eco-system is doing extremely well and, since July 2005, visitors have

been able to take guided tours of the island to see the rich biodiversity there. Birdwatchers go to the island to try to catch a glimpse of mangrove whistlers, and a heron that has been named Jimmy. There are coral reefs off the western part of the island and people have spotted dolphins, otters and green turtles swimming there.

It's predicted that all eleven 'cells' will be filled by 2030 and then the ash will be dumped on top of the cells and covered with earth, making higher hills. The government hopes that by 2045 there will be no need for landfill sites, as its recycling programme and its waste elimination programme will mean that there will be far less waste to dispose of.

It is hoped that, eventually, visitors to the island will be able to enjoy wandering around the island without a guide, and also that it becomes a nature reserve. In most countries, landfills damage the environment and ecosystems, but this landfill has actually helped create an area which is home to rare species of plants and animals.

Singapore is not the first state to dump its waste at sea. The Maldives, off the south coast of India, began dumping its waste on an island in a lagoon. The island grew, and now it is called 'Thilafushi'. It has several industries on it now, including a shipyard and a concrete manufacturing plant. However, Pulau Semakau is different because the waste is burnt first and then sealed off from the environment. Many other countries might consider following this example of sustainable urban development.




