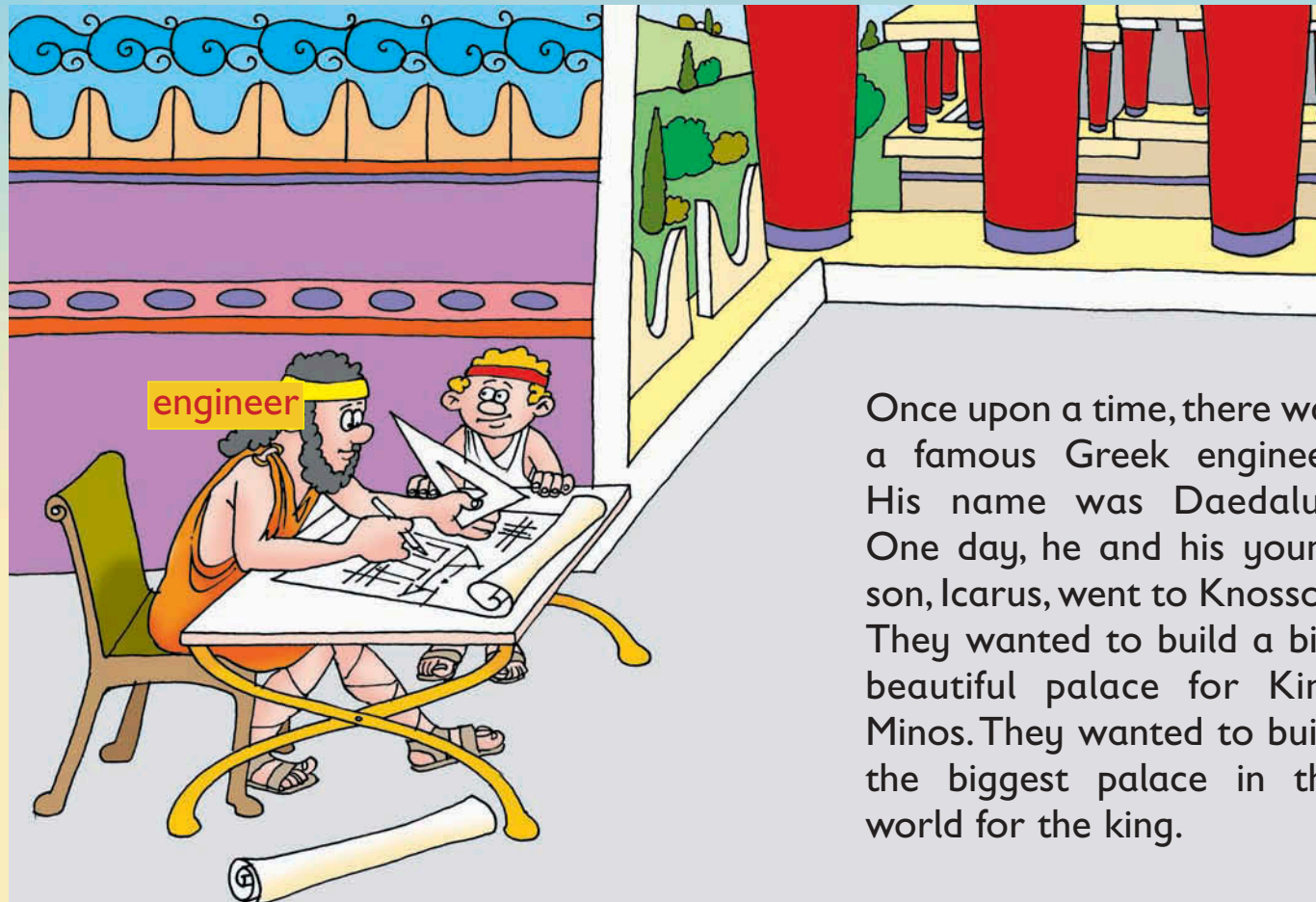
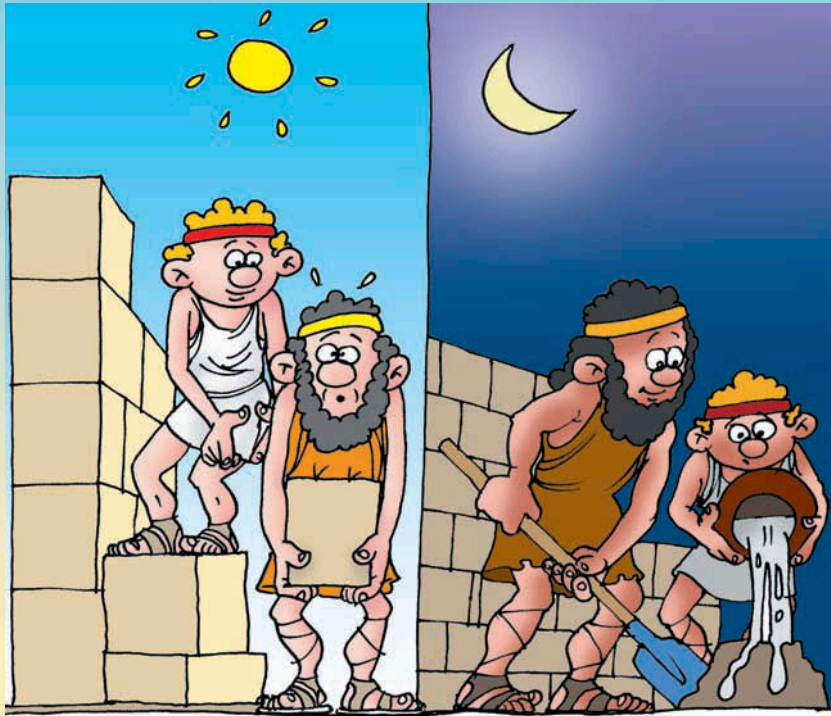


Daedalus and ICARUS

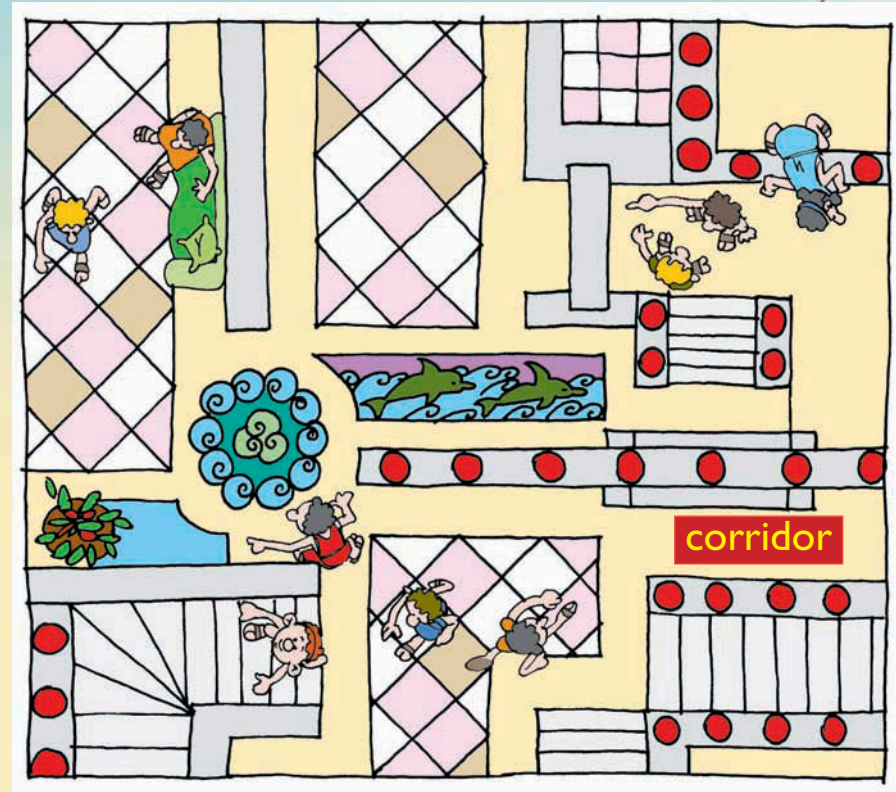

Look, look, Dad! We're free at last!

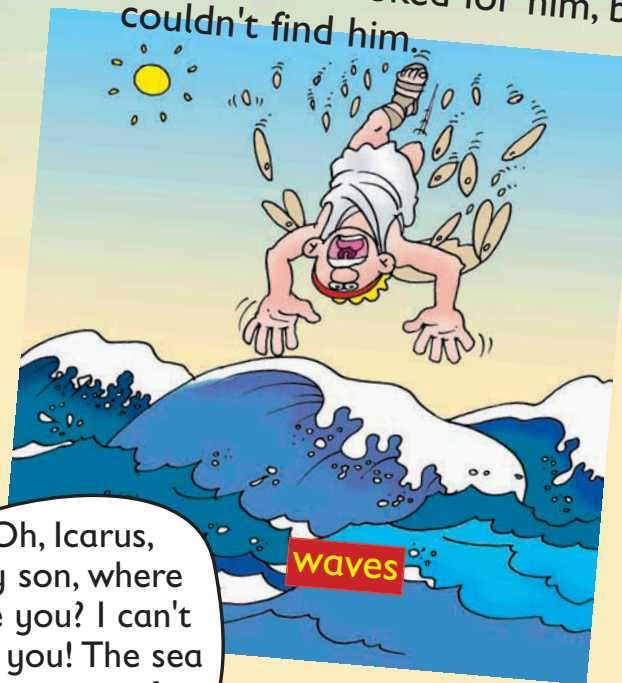


Daedalus and ICARUS
